If solved, it will normally involve the killing of a stranger who is engaging in the normal course of their daily lives or who is "in the wrong place at the wrong time". A homicide may be considered random even if the victim is selected from a pre-determined group as long as all members of the group have an equal chance of being chosen. For example, if a perpetrator is seeking to kill a female child this homicide may be random if all female children were at risk.
- 25. Authority figure e.g., teacher, doctor, baby-sitter, priest, etc.
 Criminal relationship refers to a relationship between a prostitute and client, drug trafficker and drug user, etc.
