

Conversion to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Historical Continuity of the CSNA Industry Statistics

General Note: With the implementation of NAICS in the industry structure of the Canadian System of National Accounts (CSNA), it is not possible to align perfectly the CSNA industry statistics before and after the implementation of NAICS. The table below compares, in values and percentage, gross output and GDP at factor cost according to the two classifications after aggregating them to their common historical (L) level for reference year 1997. The NAICS data are computed according to the NAICS definition while the SIC data represents an approximation of the NAICS definition. The table also provide qualitative information about the discrepancies.

1	NAICS is larger because it includes animal aquaculture (\$503,929) which is found in 1140 on the SIC side.
2	NAICS is larger because it includes timber track operations and most forest nurseries and gathering of forest products (\$41,888) which is found in 1150 on the SIC side.
3	The SIC is larger because it includes animal aquaculture (\$503,929) which is found in 11A0 on the NAICS side.
4	The SIC is larger because it includes timber track operations and most forest nurseries and gathering of forest products (\$41,888) which is found in 1130 on the NAICS side, veterinary services (\$892,436) which are found in 5410 on the NAICS side, and animal pet grooming services (\$175,909) which are found in 81A0 on the NAICS side. These differences are partially offset by aerial crop spraying (\$34,794) and aerial water bombing (\$25,307) services which are found in 48A0 on the SIC side and hauling logs out of the bush using specialized trucks (\$159,487) which is found in 4840 on the SIC side.
5	NAICS is larger because it includes clay mines (\$2,791) which are found in 327A on the SIC side.
6	NAICS is larger because it includes water irrigation and sewage services (\$136,090) which are found in 5620 on the SIC side.
7	The SIC is larger because it includes recapping and retreading tires (\$1,409,767) which is found in 3262 on the NAICS side, and the wholesale distribution of recorded media (\$309,970) which is found in 5120 on the NAICS side. The difference is partially offset by an amount of \$537,548 which is found in various manufacturing L industries on the SIC side. There is an additional amount of \$676,580 which is included in SIC wholesale trade but is found in 4A00 on the NAICS side. Finally, the remaining difference is explained by repair and maintenance activities (\$1,200,640) which are found here on the SIC side, but actually belongs to 8110 on the NAICS side.

8	The SIC is larger because it includes retail bakeries and custom tailoring (\$496,878) which are found in manufacturing on the NAICS side. The SIC also includes motor vehicle towing services (\$373,972) which are found in 48A0 on the NAICS side and one-hour photo-finishing services (\$29,950) which are found in 81A0 on the NAICS side. The SIC includes motor vehicle repairs (\$5,080,161) which are found in 8110 on the NAICS side. This is partially offset by \$676,580 for establishments selling to both consumers and business which are found in 4100 on the SIC side. Finally, activities such as custom picture framing and auctioneers (\$106,788) is found in 5610 on the NAICS side.								
9	The SIC is larger because it includes hauling logs out of the bush using specialized trucks (\$159,487) which are found in 1150 on the NAICS side and services incidental to trucking (\$10,588) which are found in 48A0 on the NAICS side. The remainder of the difference can be explained by the activity of storing households goods in trucks (\$573) which is found in 4930 on the NAICS side.								
10	The SIC is larger because it includes activities such as transportation by calèche, funiculars, tracked vehicles, human drawn vehicles and local bus sightseeing operations (\$59,068) which are found in 48A0 on the NAICS side.								
11	NAICS is larger because it includes activities such as transportation by calèche, funiculars, tracked vehicles, human drawn vehicles and local bus sightseeing operations (\$59,068) which are found in 4850 on the SIC side. NAICS also includes services incidental to trucking (\$10,588) which are found in 4840 on the SIC side, motor vehicle towing services (\$373,972) which are found in 4A00 on the SIC side, custom house brokerage services (\$1,371,505) which are found in 5610 on the SIC side, and steam train excursions and charter fishing boat services (\$44,817) which are found in 7100 on the SIC side. This is partially offset by the activity of aerial crop spraying and water bombing activities (\$60,101) which are found in 1150 on the NAICS side. Also included on the NAICS side is renting and leasing of transportation equipment such as airplanes, railroad equipment and ships and boats (\$313,206) which are found in 5A05 on the NAICS side. Professional aerial services such as air-born surveying and aerial photography (\$16,149) are found in 5410 on the NAICS side. Aircraft janitorial services (\$2,617) are found in 5610 on the NAICS side and flight and ground training school and educational services (\$8,018) are found in 611A on the NAICS side. Last, but not least, the SIC includes air ambulance services (\$5,430) which are found in 52A0 on the NAICS side and membership recreation flying clubs (\$4,761) which are found in 7100 on the NAICS side.								
12	The SIC is larger because it includes self-storage mini-warehouses (\$10,674) which are found in 5A03 on the NAICS side. This is partially offset by the activity of storing households goods in trucks (\$573) which is found in 4850 on the SIC side.								
13	The SIC is larger because it includes the mass reproduction of recorded media (not being in an integrated media recording company) (\$1,598) which is found in manufacturing under NAICS and recorded media wholesalers (\$309,970) which are found in 4100 on the NAICS side. This is partially offset by recorded media reproduction in combination with integrated media recording companies (\$18,044) which are found in manufacturing on the SIC side.								
14	NAICS is larger because it includes electronic data base publishers, software publishers and data processing services (\$3,499,224) which are found in 5410 on the SIC side and mailing list compilers, news syndicates and on-line information services (\$630,172) which are found in 5610 on the SIC side. The remaining \$92,524 difference arises because all of SIC publishing is allocated here although some should be allocated to 5122 for music publishing.								
15	The SIC is larger because it includes real estate property managers (\$1,384,434) which are found in 5A06 on the NAICS side. This is partially offset by self-storage mini-warehouses (\$10,674) which are forced in 4930 in the SIC side.								
16	NAICS is larger because it includes the rental of all transportation equipment (\$313,206) which is found in 48A0 in the SIC side, finance leasing (\$565,390) which is found in 5A06 on the SIC side, rental of computer equipment (\$540,538) which is found in 5410 on the SIC side, rental of amusement and recreational equipment (\$16,754) which is found in 7100 on the SIC side, and the rental of formal wear and non-theatrical costumes (\$34,501) which is found in 81A0 on the SIC side.								
17	NAICS is larger because it includes check cashing services (\$40,732) and real estate property managers (\$1,384,434) which are found in 5A03 on the SIC side. This is partially offset by finance leasing of machinery and equipment (\$565,390) which is found in 5A05 on the NAICS side. The remaining difference (\$130,689) is explained by the splitting up of Central Credit Unions in NAICS.								
18	NAICS is larger because it includes professional aerial services such as air-born surveying and aerial photography (\$16,149) which are found in 48A0 on the SIC side, veterinary services (\$892,436) which are found in 1150 on the SIC side, and public relations services (\$147,340) which are found in 5610 on the SIC side. NAICS also includes activities such as interior and industrial and other special design services, management consulting services, economic research services, marketing research and public opinion polling, and translation and interpretation services (\$5,269,746) which are found in 5610 on the SIC side.
