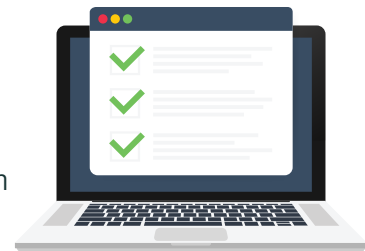
## Why is Statistics Canada conducting this survey?

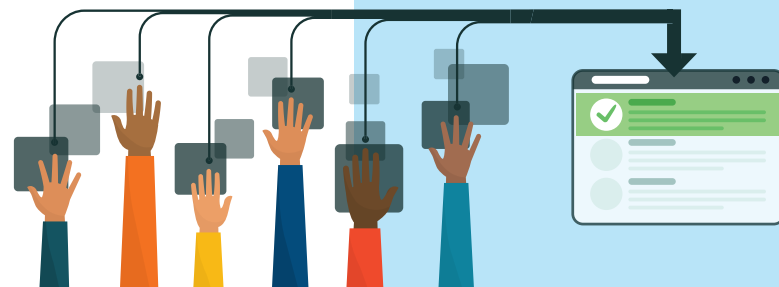
