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## Community College Student Information System

The Community College Student Information System (CCSIS) is a data base that provides a Canada-wide system of enrolment and graduate statistics of community colleges and other institutions offering similar training. Files are available on the full-time postsecondary enrolment of these institutions from the 1976-77 academic year. Aggregates of data can be generated on the full-time enrolment and the graduates of these institutions by program of study, year of study and sex.

The system is designed to store individual student records, and as more data become available in that format, cross-tabulations of selected characteristics will be possible.

#### Coverage

Report all students registered for program which are eligible for academic credit in a diploma or certificate program or in a university transfer program. Also include students registered in co-op programs who are on a work assignment at the time of survey.

Report students registered for diplomas or certificates awarded by a professional body <u>if</u> such programs form part of the regular offerings of the institution.

Institutions will be asked to submit 2 reports per year, on September 1 and December 1.

For the September 1 report, institutions are asked to report all students who graduated from their institution between August 1 of the previous year and July 31 of the current year. The easiest way to prepare this report would be to flag graduates on the December 1 enrolment report from the previous year.

For the December 1 report, institutions are asked to report all students enrolled at their institution as of October 31 of this academic year.

## **Reporting Options**

The reporting options are as follows:

- 1. Individual student records on cartridge.
- 2. Individual student records on diskette (IBM compatable).

Note: For those institutions reporting on cartridge, Statistics Canada will make available blank cartridges.

This element refers to type of attendance rather than length of course. Students enrolled in short-term courses, who are considered full-time students while at the institution, should be coded '1'. Similarly, students in co-op programs should be coded according to their type of attendance as defined by the reporting institution.
