Trade/Vocational Enrolment Survey

The Trade/Vocational Enrolment Survey prior to 1992-93 provided a Canada-wide data base on full-time enrolments and completions in trade/vocational programs offered by community colleges, public vocational schools and other similar institutions. The survey obtained aggregate counts of full-time students by program rather than student records.

Beginning in 1992-93 the requested method of reporting the data changed from aggregate to **individual student records** for both full and **part-time** enrolment.

Complete data files are available from 1983-84 and can be obtained in specially requested computer-generated tabulations. Trade/vocational information prior to 1983-84 is available only in publication format from 1959-60 to 1976-77 in Statistics Canada catalogue 81-209, <u>Enrolment in Vocational Training</u> and catalogue 81-239, <u>Students in Public Trade Schools and Similar Institutions</u>.

Coverage

All students registered in a full or part-time trade/vocational program should be reported. If students are attending full-time, with the exception of those in registered apprenticeship programs, a period of one year or less is usually sufficient to complete programs at the trade/vocational level. Although prerequisites may vary, a secondary school completion is normally not required for students entered in trade/vocational programs.

Include students registered in the following programs:

<u>Pre-employment or pre-apprenticeship vocational programs</u> designed to provide training for occupations in which the student has had little or no prior preparation. Successful completion should qualify the student to enter the labour force using the acquired knowledge and skill.

<u>Registered apprenticeship programs</u> leading to a journeyman status in a number of designated trades that fall under tha direction of a provincial department of labour (or its equivalent). This method of learning by acquiring skills and knowledge combines on-the-job-training and short periods of formal instruction. Upon completion of required courses and work experience, apprentices become qualified tradespeople.

<u>Pre-vocational academic upgrading or basic training for skill development (B.T.S.D.) programs</u> designed to upgrade the knowledge and skill for further training or employment. They are aimed at improving a student's knowledge in the basic subjects of mathematics, English, French, and the general sciences.

<u>Language training programs</u> consisting primarily of second language courses designed to give the student a basic understanding and working knowledge of English or French.

<u>Skill upgrading programs</u> designed to instruct students in new occupational methods and techniques. These students have prior training and work experience in their occupation, but have fallen behind in qualifications due to technological changes or other developments.

<u>Job readiness training programs</u> designed to increase the employability of students wanting to enter or re-enter the labour force. The program assists students by providing them with career exploration, job search, life skills and basic academic training.

<u>Orientation programs</u> designed to guide students into trade or vocational occupations and provide them with job search skills. The programs are not designed to teach the skills necessary for specific employment but to provide the student with sufficient knowledge to pursue an occupation. Programs included in this category are Career Exploration, Employment Orientation for Women, Introduction to Non-traditional Occupations, Industrial Orientation, etc.

<u>Special training or other programs</u> that do not fit into one of the predefined categories. Included in this category are customized training projects.

Institutions are asked to submit one report for a twelve-month period. As much as the reporting period of September 1 to August 31 is preferred, other periods are acceptable.

Reporting Options

The reporting options are as follows:

- 1. Individual student records on cartridge;
- 2. Individual student records on diskette (IBM compatable).

For those wishing to report on cartridge, Statistics Canada will make available blank cartridges.

Element: Institution

Description:

A 8-digit numeric code for reporting institutions. Note that several small adult vocational centres or college campuses within a province may be grouped under one number.

Digit 1: institution type (2=college 4=school board for Quebec only)

Digits 2-3: province in which institution is located.

Digits 4-8: institution complex.

Element: Reporting Period of the Survey

Description:

Institutions are asked to submit a report for a twelve-month period. As much as the reporting period of September 1 to August 31 is preferred, other periods are acceptable.

This element should identify the start date (month/year) of the reporting period.

Element: Student Identification Number

Description:

Student identification number to be determined by the reporting institution. It may be alphabetic and/or numeric (i.e. SIN). It is only required to facilitate the editing and verification of the information with the institution.

Element: Immigration or Legal Status in Canada

Description:

This determines whether a student is currently a Canadian citizen. If not, it determines his/her immigration status in Canada. (Please provide up-to-date status at time of registration).

Codes:

- 0 = Canadian citizen (including Inuit, North American Indian and Metis
- 1 = Permanent resident (Landed Immigrant)

Foreign Students

- 2 = Student authorization (Student Visa): a permit obtained by a student to enter Canada for the sole purpose of attending an educational instituition.
- 3 = Other visa (including students who are in Canada on diplomatic, work, trade or other missions)
- 4 = Foreign Student immigration status undetermined (including refugees)

Note:

The information should be updated if a student's immigration or legal status in Canada has changed since last reported. Please insure that this information reflects status at time of registration.

Element: Country of Current Citizenship

Description:

Code country of current citizenship. For permanent resident (formerly landed immigrant) code the country of which the student is currently a citizen, not Canada. In those cases when a student is from a colony or a dependency, code the colony or dependency and not the parent country. For example, code St. Pierre et Miquelon as the country of citizenship for students from that dependency even though France is the country from which they hold citizenship.

If dual citizenship, (Canadian and other) report student as Canadian citizen. However, if the dual citizenship does not include Canadian, report citizenship of country of last residence.

Note:

Country codes are constructed in the following way:

First 3 digits: Unique identifier for each country.

Fourth digit: Identifies continent in which country is located.

Fourth and Fifth digit: Identify continent and region within continent in which country is located.

Element: Year of Study

Description:

This element identifies the year of the program in which the student is enrolled, i.e., first year, second year, etc.

With most programs of less than one year, the year of study will be a code "zero". However, if a program is 25 to 52 weeks in length, report the student as being in the first year of the program.

For programs which are usually greater than one year in length indicate the year of the program in which the student is taking training at your institution.

Codes:

- 0 =Program less than one year
- 1 = First year
- 2 = Second year
- 3 =Third year
- 4 = Fourth year
- 5 = Fifth year or greater

Element: Duration of Program

Description:

This element identifies the number of weeks in each year of the program and the number of years normally required to complete the program. Consisting of 11 digits, the first digit is the length of the program in years and the remaining are for the length in weeks for each year (One 1-digit and five 2-digit items).

Many trade/vocational programs are less than one year in length and should be coded as "zero". If a program is 25 to 52 weeks in length, report it as being one year in length. Programs of longer duration, such as 13 to 24 months, should be coded as two years in length.

For students in registered apprenticeship programs, which are usually greater than one year, report the entire length of the program.

If the program is less than one year in length, use Y1 to indicate the length of the program in weeks and code all other items "zero." If the program is less than one week in length, code 01 in Y1.

Element: Sponsorship

Description:

The means by which a student finances his/her tuition fees during training.

Element: Registration Status of the Student

Description:

This element identifies a student's registration status as full-time or part-time as defined by your institution.

Please note, a "not reported" code is not acceptable in this field.

Element: Status at the Beginning of the Program

Description:

This element indicates whether a student is new to your institution, whether he/she was enrolled during the previous reporting year, or returning after one or more years of absence. Report the status of the student at the beginning of each program. If a program begins at different times during a reporting period, indicate the status of the student at these times.

Codes:

- 1 = <u>Continuing/returning student</u> one who was enrolled at your institution in one or more programs during the current or previous reporting year. If the student was still enrolled at the end of the previous reporting period he/she should be continuing into the current reporting period.
- 2 = <u>Re-entering student</u> one who was previously registered at your institution but not during the previous reporting period.
- 3 =<u>New student</u> one who is registered at your institution for the first time.

Element: Status at the End of the Current Program

Description:

This element is used to determine the status of the student at the end of the current program or at the end of the reporting year if they are the same.

If an institution or province bases its report on the fiscal year, they may find many of their programs beginning in one reporting period and continuing into the next. If this occurs at the end of a current reporting year and the program continues into the next reporting period, students enrolled in these programs should be identified as still enrolled.

If a student is in a registered apprenticeship program, which could be several years in length, report the status for the end of each year or level of the program and not for the entire program. A student who completes each year or level of an apprenticeship program should be reported as <u>successfully completed</u>.

Element: Previous Educational Experience

Description:

This element identifies the highest level of education attained prior to registration in this program.

- 4 Previously enrolled in community college program but did not complete (other than trade/vocational or continuing education program)

Element: Multiple Record Indicator

Description:

Because of the short duration of some trade/vocational programs it is possible for a student to register and complete more than one program in the same reporting period.

This field will not be applicable in many cases and can be ignored (left blank) if the student was enrolled in only one program during the reporting year. If the student was registered in more than one program, assign 1 to the multiple record indicator field for the first record and 2 for the second, etc.

Codes:
