These data provide input into Canada's System of National Accounts for the calculation of the Gross Domestic Product They are also used by various government departments to develop policy and to monitor the industry.

Coverage

Public railway carriers operating in Canada.

Confidentiality

The data are used for statistical purposes only and published in aggregate form. Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from publishing any statistics that divulge information that relate to any identifiable business without the prior written consent of that business. The confidentiality provisions of the Statistics Act are not affected by the Access to Information Act or any other legislation.

Federal Provincial Data Sharing Agreements

To avoid duplication and ease the burden on respondents, Statistics Canada has entered into an agreement under section 12 of the Statistics Act, with Transport Canada, for the sharing of information collected in this survey.

In the case of non-federally regulated carriers, the information will be used by Transport Canada only for statistical and research purposes. Under section 12, respondents may object to the sharing of their information by giving notice in writing to the Chief Statistician and returning their letter of objection along with the completed questionnaire in the enclosed envelope.

In the case of federally-regulated carriers, Statistics Canada is collecting the information for itself pursuant to the Statistics Act and on behalf of Transport Canada pursuant to the Canadian Transportation Act and the Carriers Information Regulations. In this case, respondents do not have the right to object to sharing their information since Transport Canada is authorized by law to require the respondent to provide the information.

General Instructions

- (a) Report revenue freight only. Do not report on company service (O.C.S.) shipments.
- (b) Part I is to be used to report cars and tonnes for non-intermodal traffic loaded.
- (c) Part II is to be used to report total cars and tonnes received from other rail carriers.
- (d) Part III is to be used to report number of units, *TEUs and tonnes for total intermodal traffic loaded.
- Part IV is to be used to report number of units, *TEUs and tonnes for intermodal traffic received from U.S. carriers (e)
- Indicate if weight is reported in Imperial tons or metric tonnes.
- TFIJ. Twenty Foot Equivalent Unit .

Part I: Non-Intermodal Traffic Loaded Report:

- (a) Cars and tonnes of revenue freight moved in line-haul service only, excluding all switching movements.
- (b) Cars and tonnes of revenue freight moved on ferries and barges where these connect with rail points and form an integral part of a rail line-haul.
- Idler or trailer cars as separate cars.
- (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit. Otherwise report each car and its contents only once.
- (e) Cars and tonnes of common carrier subsidiary railway lines operating in Canada.

Count as loaded, cars and tonnes of:

- (a) Freight loaded at point of origin on the line of the respondent including receipts from private industrial railways.
- Freight received from switching railways for initial line-haul by the respondent.
- Freight received from other modes of transport (e.g., highway, water, air, etc.) except when identified as having moved by rail at an earlier stage of its journey, or where movement is at joint rates on through billing.
- (d) Freight reshipped following stopovers for milling grain elevators, fabrication, etc., in transit.
- (e) Show tonnage only, for less-than-carload freight.

Do not count as loaded, cars and tonnes of:

- (a) Freight handled in switching service where no line haul is involved.
- (b) Freight re-billed, diverted, reconsigned or transhipped enroute where previous loadings or receipts from connections have been recorded.

Part II: Traffic received from other rail carriers

Count as received from connections, cars and tonnes of:

- Freight received directly from connecting Canadian or United States rail carriers, including traffic loaded by the respondent on its lines in the U.S. and transported across the border for delivery in Canada.
- Freight received from other modes of transport (e.g. highway, water, air, etc.) when moved at joint rates on through billing, or when identified as having moved by rail at an earlier stage of its journey.
- (c) Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

Do not count as received from connections, cars and tonnes of:

(a) Freight received from rail connections for delivery at the same terminal (switching movements).

Part III: Total Intermodal Traffic Loaded

Report:

(a) Units (number of containers or trailers), TEUs (containers only) and tonnes for all intermodal traffic loaded, whether or not the content is known by commodity. Do not report carloads. Do not report non-revenue movements of trailers or containers returned empty.

Part IV: Intermodal Traffic Received from U.S. Connections

(a) Units (number of containers or trailers), TEUs (containers only) and tonnes for intermodal traffic received from U.S. connections.
