To obtain consistency in reporting between schools operating on different cycles (e.g. week, 6-day cycle, 7-day cycle, etc.), the calculation of the percentage of French (English in Quebec) instruction is based on each school's own cycle.

 $\frac{45 \text{ (min./period) X 4 (periods/week)}}{1500 (300 \text{ min./day x 5 days)}} \times 100 = 12.0$ If semestered, divide above % by 2. e.g., % of school week = 12.0 = 6.0


