## SECTION E. GENERAL INFORMATION

## Confidentiality

Your answers are confidential.

Statistics Canan? will only share data from this survey with those organizations that have demonstrated a requirement to use the data.

Section 11 of the Statistics Act provides for the sharing of information with provincial $=$ atistical agencies that meet certain conditions. These agencies must have the legislative authority to collect the same inf rmation, on a mandatory basis, and the legislation must provide substantially the same provisions for confidentiality and penakies for uisclosure of confidential information as the Statistics Act. Because these agencies have the legal authority to compel busin $\mathrm{con}^{\circ}$ to provide the same information, consent is not requested and farm operations may not object to the sharing of their data.

For this survey, there are Section 11 agreements with the prsincial tatistical agencies of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia.

The shared data will be limited to information pertaining to farr, opel ations located within the jurisdiction of the respective province.
