#### Coverage

#### Survey Objective

The survey objective is the conection and publication of data necessary for the statistical analysis of the Internet Service Providers and Related Services industry. The information from the survey can be used by businesses and trade associations for market analysis and assessment of industry performance, elections characteristics and trends, by government to develop national and regional economic policies, by other users involved in research of policy making and by Statistics Canada for maintaining important data input to the preparation of the Canadian System of National Accounts.

### Confidentiality

Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from publishing any statistics which would divulge information relating to any identifiable business without the previous written consent of that business. The data reported on this questionnaire will be treated in strict confidence, used for statistical purposes, and published in aggregate form only. The confidentiality provisions of the Statistics Act are not affected by either the Access to Information Act or by any other legislation.

#### Data Sharing Agreements

To reduce response burden and to ensure more uniform statistics, Statistics Canada has entered into a data sharing agreement under section 12 of the Statistics Act with the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC), for the sharing of information from all respondents. Subsection 12(2) of the Statistics Act provides that where a respondent gives notice in writing to the Chief Statistician that the respondent objects to the sharing of the information by Statistics Canada, the information will not be shared with the department or corporation unless the department or corporation is authorized by law to require the respondent to provide the information. The CRTC is authorized by law to require the respondent to provide the information under section 37 of the Telecommunications Act. Information provided to the CRTC will be treated in accordance with the requirements of section 39 of the Telecommunications Act.
