The Victim Services Survey is distributed across Canada to all system-based, police-based, court-based and community-based victim services, sexual assault centres and provincial/territorial financial benefits programs for victims of crime. While participation in this survey is voluntary, your co-operation is important to ensure that information collected in this survey is as accurate and comprehensive as possible. The information collected will be useful for service providers, non-government organizations and governments for developing programs, policies and services to victims of crime.
